



Stitch Guide

Here is a selection of our favourite embroidery stitches. We recommend to split your embroidery thread and use only 2 stands for better results.

Running stitch: A simple zigzag line of thread.

Back stitch: A series of connected 'V' shapes.

Cross stitch: Two intersecting lines forming an 'X' shape.

Fly stitch: A series of 'V' shapes with a short stem, numbered 1-4.

French knot: A circular knot on a stem, numbered 1-2.

joined: A series of connected 'V' shapes forming a leafy stem.

Lazy daisy stitch: A series of teardrop shapes, numbered 1-4.

Chain stitch: A series of teardrop shapes connected by a central line, numbered 1-5.

Appliqué: A decorative border with a needle and thread.

Buttonhole wheel: A circular wheel-like pattern, numbered 1-5.

Buttonhole flower: A sun-like flower pattern, numbered 1-6.

Single threaded running stitch: A wavy line of thread, numbered 1-2.

Double threaded running stitch: A wavy line of thread with two strands, numbered 1-2.

Eskimo lace stitch: A series of connected 'V' shapes, numbered 1-2.

Star stitch: A star-like pattern with a central point, numbered 1-2.

Spiderweb stitch (woven): A circular spiderweb pattern, numbered 1-2.

Whipped spiderweb stitch: A circular spiderweb pattern with a central point, numbered 1-2.
