Can you help with the Federation Finances?

The Federation is looking to fill two posts – Finance Assistant and Federation Treasurer. The Finance Assistant is required to bring the accounts together for the monthly reports for the Board Meetings. The Purchase and Sales Ledgers are currently processed by existing staff. The accounts software is cloud based Sage Business Accounts and therefore the role is not necessarily office based. We estimate this currently takes 2 days per month. The Federation Treasurer role requires a person who can contribute financial expertise and oversight to the Board of Trustees. We estimate this currently takes 1-2 days per month. 
Receipt Books and other WI Stationery


